

On July 23rd, your councillors are considering a vote to stop supporting renewable energy development in West Hants.

Council's bylaw amendment would eliminate the development of green energy projects in all but a small area, becoming the **most stringent setbacks in the country.**



Every renewable energy project is required to complete a comprehensive Provincial Environmental Assessment with industry setbacks and clear provisions to mitigate local environmental impacts.

EverWind and other wind power project developers are planning on **investing hundreds of millions of dollars in West Hants** for the generation of clean, renewable wind power.



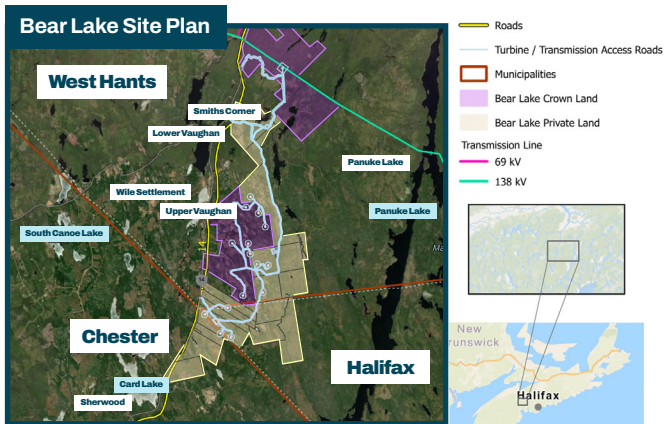
Donations of \$100k per year including a community vibrancy fund, led by the community liaison committee.
